Creating a Class Page

A Class Page allows a teacher to provide student access to any resource from within LearningMedia that has been marked as a Favorite. Once a teacher has created favorites, the Class Page can be created.

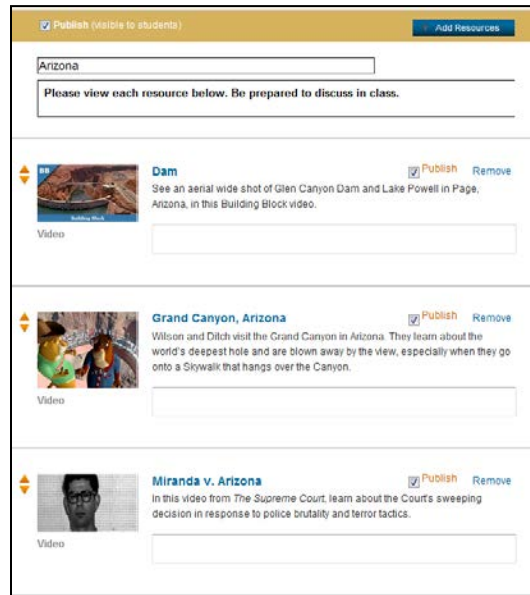
1. While logged into your <http://az.pbslearningmedia.org> account, click on **My Favorites**.
2. Click on the **View Class Page** button.

3. Type the title of your Class Page, and create an introduction where it states, “Welcome to my Class Page. Click the **Save** button.

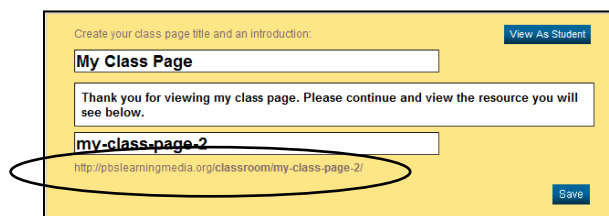
4. After you click the Save button as instructed above, you will see the student URL and an **Add New Section** button. You can make any changes to the wording in your Class Page information, but remember to click **Save**.

5. You can add multiple Sections to your Class Page. For example: a math section, language arts section, science section, etc. Click the **Add New Section** button.
6. In the top data field, type the title of your section. In the bottom data field, type a set of instructions for the students. You must click **Save**. If you want the students to be able to view this Section, you must checkbox **Publish**. After you click Save, you will see the **Add Resources** button.

- Click the **Add Resources** button. You will see the **Add Resources to Class Page** window. Check any resource you wish to add to this Section, and click on **Add to Section**. (You may need to scroll your window).
- You will now see your Section with any added Resources. You can always add additional Resources, or you can remove Resources. If you have more than one Resource in your Section, you can even change their order by clicking on the little, orange up and down arrows.



- If you wish, you can add additional Sections by clicking on Add New Section. Your sections are listed to the left in the **My Class Page** module. To view a section, click on its title.
- When you are ready for students to view your Class Page, you must provide them with the **URL/Web Address** listed under your Class Page title and introduction.



There are many ways that students can access your class page: school computer labs, classroom computer centers, media centers and even at home. If you find creative ways to use this, please let us know.
